

Abstract

Hippolytia gossypina (Hook. f. & Thoms. ex C B. Clarke) Shih and Lactuca decipiens C. B. Clarke are reported for the first time from West Bengal.

Introduction

We report *Hypotytia gossipina* (Hook. f. & Thoms. ex C. B. Clarke) Shih, *Lactuca decipiens* C. B. Clarke and *L. decipiens* var. *multifida* Hook. f. (Asteraceae) from Darjeeling district of West Bengal based on old collections housed at CAL. These taxa are new records for West Bengal.

Hippolytia gossypina was earlier reported from Uttar Pradesh and Sikkim, and Lactuca decipiens C. B. Clarke and L. decipiens var. multifida Hook. f. from the West Himalayas.

Densely tufted cushion plants, 4-10 cm tall; white to pale brown, softly woolly; stem short, densely clothed with short, silky, imbricating, c. 3 mm long leaves; flowering shoots 2.5-5 cm long, stout, simple, densely leafy; rootstock woody; leafy shoots short, densely compacted with short, quadrate silky, most densely imbricating leaves. Leaves inconspicuously petiolate, cuneiform, 6-8 mm long, 3-fid, appressed and more or less scarious below, lobes usually oblong and obtuse; leaf blade spatulate, white or greywhite, both surfaces densely long lanose, apex truncate or rounded, 3-6 divided; leaves of flowering stem stout, simple, dense, spreading from base. Capitula in rounded, terminal, dense woolly clusters, c. 10, 2.5-6 mm in diam. at apices of branches; involucres cuneate, c. 6 mm in diam; involucral bracts linear-oblong with scarious purple

margins, in 3 rows, hairy; receptacle hemispheric, naked; outer florets absent or fertile, female, 1-seriate; disc florets hermaphrodite, fertile, ca 4 mm long, including the achenes, tube cylindric; limb 5-fid. *Achenes* 2 mm, narrowly obovoid; pappus absent.

Flowering & Fruiting: August-October.

Habitat: Deserts, alpine gravel heaps, exposed rocks at mountain summits; 4300-5400 m.

Distribution: India: (Uttar Pradesh, Sikkim and West Bengal), Nepal and Bhutan.

Specimen Examined: West Bengal, Darjeeling, Phalloot, 4340 m., S. Kurz s.n. (CAL).

Perennial herbs; stem 30-80 cm high, erect, paniculately branched above. Leaves entire, pinnatifid or slightly lobed, 7-14 x 2.5-5 cm, glaucous, pubescent; lower leaves often with backward pointing lobes; upper middle with long, winged, dilated and auricled petiole at base; petiole 0.5-7 cm long; uppermost oblanceolate; margins serrate. Inflorescence terminal panicle; heads cylindric, 1.2-1.8 x 0.3-0.4 cm; peduncle slender, glabrous, drooping; outer involucral bracts oblong-ovate, 4-6.5 x 1.5-2.5 mm, unequal; inner linear-oblong or linear-lanceolate, 12-14 x 2.5-3 mm; ligules whitish pink; corolla bilaterally symmetric, slender and flat, 5 - toothed; style slender, purplish; stigmatic branches purplish. Achenes pale brown or dark brown, 5-6.6 mm long, much compressed, hairy towards margins, rugose, stoutly beaked with one strong median rib; pappus dirty white, 4-5 mm long, simple.

Key to varieties

- 1a. Leaves entire or slightly lobed; petiole 0.5-2.4 cm long; achenes with brown and stout beak...... var. decipiens
- 1b. Leaves all pinnatifid; petiole 2.5-7 cm long; achenes with white beak var. multifida

Flowering & Fruiting: July - November.

Habitat: Open moist shady slopes in temperate broad-leaved forests.

Distribution: India, (Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttaranchal and West Bengal), Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nepal.

Specimen Examined: West Bengal, Darjeeling, between Sandakphu and Phallut, 3,860 m, 19 October 1904, I.H. Burkill 25227 (CAL).

Flowering & Fruiting: July – November.

Distribution: India (Jammu & Kashmir, West Bengal), endemic

Specimen Examined: **West Bengal**, Darjeeling, East of Phallut, *c*. 3,330m., 2 October 1904, *I.H. Burkill* 25349 (CAL).

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
